2021 ALL-STAR GAME FACTS & FIGURES (And Ironies): Updated 1/2/22

1. Final score: South 12, North 7
2. Weather: 33 = outside temperature at game time; however, it was 68 inside U.S. Bank Stadium.
3. The South now leads the overall North-South series 17-10-1. The South leads the current North-South series 9-2, has won five straight and nine of the last ten games.
4. The South now has its longest winning streak (five games) and ties the longest overall winning streak in All-Star Game history (North 1945-46, 1952-54)
5. Little known fact / irony:
The South All-Stars are 8-0 in games played on Minnesota Vikings' home fields. The South is now 5-0 at U.S. Bank Stadium. The South was 3-0 in the three games played at the first Vikings home field - Metropolitan Stadium in Bloomington (1976-1978). The All-Star game was never played at the second Vikings home field - the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome.
6. Game Record set = most interceptions (both teams combined) = 6 (South 4, North 2)
The previous record was 5 (1983, 1995).
7. The four interceptions by the South team was the most interceptions recorded by a South All-Star team in game history.
8. Tied game record: Fewest Rushing Touchdowns – Two Teams Combined (0)

9. All-State Players - the December 2021 All-Star game included 29 All-State selections (down from 38 in 2019, however in 2019 the AP selected a First, Second and Third All-State team; 2021 had an AP First and Second All-State team):
